Dr Michael Armstrong

Anatomical Pathology

MBBS, FRCPA

After graduating from the University of Western Australia in 1988, Dr Armstrong completed his medical training in Perth with rotations in all major departments at Sir Charles Gairdner Hospital. In 1990 Dr Armstrong completed six months of training in Clinical Immunology at Sir Charles Gairdner Hospital. Following this, he commenced five years of anatomical pathology training at Royal Perth Hospital, Fremantle Hospital and King Edward Memorial Hospital. He obtained Fellowship of the Royal College of Pathologists of Australasia in 1995.

Prior to joining Perth Pathology, Dr Armstrong held positions at Royal Perth Hospital, Advancepath, Specialist Histopathology Service, Western Diagnostic pathology and more recently Healthscope. In 2007 Dr Armstrong joined Perth Pathology and was Director of Anatomical Pathology for four years before being appointed to his current role in 2015. Dr Armstrong also consults at King Edward Memorial Hospital and Fiona Stanley Hospital. His special interests are in Gastro-intestinal Pathology, Gynaecologic Pathology, Cytology and Dermatopathology. He is a visiting external examiner at Notre Dame Medical School, Fremantle.

Dr Barham graduated from Newcastle University and worked at several NSW hospitals before moving to Western Australia and commencing specialist pathology training in 2000. After receiving his FRCPA in 2005 he was a consultant histopathologist and cytopathologist for six years at Western Diagnostic Pathology. Dr Heenan graduated from the University of Western Australia and completed his pathology training at the Radcliffe Infirmary, Oxford, where he developed a special interest in skin pathology. After returning to Perth he joined the Department of Pathology, UWA, as Senior Lecturer, later as Associate Professor.

Peter established Cutaneous Pathology, the first private skin pathology service in WA, in 1987, combining teaching and research with a comprehensive diagnostic service. He has contributed to the WHO Histological Typing of Skin Tumours, the UICC TNM clinical staging of melanoma, the ACN Guidelines for the Management of Melanoma and was the first director of the WA Melanoma Advisory Service. Dr Heenan is a past President of the Australian Dermatopathology Society, past Vice President of the International Society of Dermatopathology and is currently a Clinical Professor of Pathology, UWA.

After graduating from Medicine at the University of Western Australia, Dr Lau trained at several Perth public and private hospitals before commencing specialist pathology training in 2009 at Royal Perth Hospital and Sir Charles Gairdner Hospital.
